

How to convert RAW files to Jpeg using Adobe Bridge

Step1

Open Adobe Bridge CS5 on your computer.

Step2

Click the "Folders" tab in the upper right corner, then click the folder containing the CR2 images you want to convert to JPEGs.

Step3

Click the "Essentials" view tab in the upper right corner of the application window.

Step4

Select the photos you want to convert. Use the "Shift" key to select multiple photos in a row or the "Command" key to select multiple nonconsecutive photos. Depending on how powerful your computer is, selecting more than 20 photos at a time may slow it down.

Step5

Click the "Open in Camera Raw" icon at the top of the page. The icon resembles a leaf shutter on a lens. Camera Raw is included in Adobe Bridge, Adobe Photoshop and the CS5 Creative Suite.

Step6

Click "Select All" at the top of the left column in the Camera Raw window. Use the settings panel on the left to make any adjustments to your RAW photos for brightness, contrast, saturation, white balance or exposure.

Step7

Click the "Save Images" button in the bottom left corner of the Camera Raw window.

Step8

Click the tab next to Destination if you want to save your images in a different folder. If you want to save them in the same location, leave the destination as it is.

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Step9

Click the tab next to File Extension and select ".JPG."

Step10

Click the "Save" button to convert your CR2 images to JPEG. Camera Raw displays the number of images remaining to convert in the bottom left corner of the application window. Make sure your photos have finished converting before you close the Camera Raw window.
